With new intakes of staff at this time of year, we like to provide an overview of what we offer:

Journals: All journals, whether purchased nationally, KSS-Wide or just for MTW, and whether they are single titles or part of a large collection (such as Clinical Key) are protected by Athens. They are listed alphabetically at: <http://www.library.nhs.uk/booksandjournals/journals/> and can also be searched for at: <http://secn3.ent.sirsiidynix.net.uk/client/default>

E-Books: These are expanding – we now have over 1200 ebook titles available. Search for them via the catalogue link above.

Databases: Standard NHS databases such as Medline (Pubmed), Embase, Cinahl and PsycInfo can be searched after logging in to the NICE Evidence website; doing this rather than searching Google or Pubmed means all the articles from the several thousand journals available in the NHS via Athens will be linked directly from your results. <http://www.nice.org.uk/about/what-we-do/evidence-services/journals-and-databases>

Critical Resources: Key resources such as the BNF require Athens. All KSS F1 trainees were pre-registered for Athens this year. All other NHS Staff, students and trainees are entitled to have an Athens account so that they can access this resource and others critical to patient care, research, and CPD. WE CAN HELP YOU REGISTER, RESET PASSWORDS AND CHANGE YOUR INSTITUTION SO THAT YOU GET ALL NATIONAL AND LOCAL RESOURCES.

Clinical Key: This large database of e-books and journals has added Table of Contents alerting to its functionality. Simply log-in to Clinical Key, search for journals that interest you, and click the link for *New Issue Alerts: Subscribe*. You can unsubscribe at any time. <https://www.clinicalkey.com/>

UpToDate: Ever popular, this database is a point-of-care Q&A system. It is currently linked directly from the Trust Intranet (so bypasses Athens while you are at work), and can be accessed at home via Athens. We are about to renew and upgrade to Up-To-Date Anywhere which will allow anyone with Athens to use the database on iphone/ tablets, personalise alerts and collect CPD points. *Watch this space.....* <http://www.uptodate.com/home>

Clinical Skills: This is a new resource, purchased this summer. It supports training and best practice in clinical skills. More than 200 guidelines on clinical skills procedures all in highly illustrated step-by-step format.
