Within the Trust we have the following service/programmes in place to tackle high attendance

- GP based in the Emergency Department
- Minors Department
- AEC (Ambulatory Emergency Care)
- Frailty Unit
- Therapies, include Allied Health Professionals
- Appointment based Nurse Practitioners
- Flow Co-Ordinators

High Intensity Users (HIUs)

- Bi-weekly reviews with South East Coast Ambulance Trust which includes discussions on pathways and also HIUs
- Monthly meetings with all healthcare partners discussing HIUs
- Named HIU lead (Consultant lead)
- Direct access to mental health services
- Kent Community Hospitals Foundation Trust Frequent Users services
