
Q1 Have you ever submitted a new case to the scheme?







Q4 Are you aware that with each new complete case that you submit to the scheme, you will earn 1 CPD point?



Q5 Would you like photos of immunohistochemistry staining included in the circulations?



Q6 When submitting a new case, would you be prepared to send photos of immunohistochemistry or other relevant staining?




