

A Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) developed by the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) Clinical Research Network (CRN), University of Leeds, and FutureLearn is due to run again in November 2017 and is open for registration.

The MOOC is a four week online course and is free of charge. The course works alongside online materials and online community of learners, and aims to answer some pertinent questions, including:

- 'How are treatments and cures discovered?'
- 'What is the impact of clinical research?'
- 'How do we undertake clinical research?'
- 'Why do we do clinical research?'

The fifth MOOC is entitled 'Improving Healthcare through Clinical Research' and will run from 6th November 2017
