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Freedom of Information Act 2000

I am writing in response to your request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 in relation to Alzheimer Disease.

For the years between 2012 and 2016

- 1. How many people has your trust/hospital diagnosed with Alzheimer Disease for each of the years mentioned above? If possible could this be broken down by gender?
- 2. How many people are seen within 12 weeks of being referred by a GP?
- 1. The following is the occurrence of the code G30.0-G30.9 in a patients spell, i.e. it may be the primary or secondary diagnoses.

 Many of the following are patients who return for a subsequent stay in hospital but since the diagnosis of G30.0-G30.9 is entered again the patient is identified again. Therefore after the total below, the actual number of individual patients this equates to is entered for information.

2. Any referral from GP to the hospital would be seen as an outpatient before being added to the relevant list for an inpatients stay. Since Outpatients are not coded, it is not possible to identify specific referrals for Alzheimer's from the Outpatient data, to be able to determine how many were seen within 12 weeks.

In terms those which are inpatients, as the following shows, the majority of inpatients with a diagnosis code of Alzheimer's are non-elective, so would not have arrived via a GP referral to Outpatients.
