- 4. How often does the Awards Committee change its members, or is each new member given a 'term of office'?*
- 5. How are staff put forward for a Clinical Excellence Award, and what is the basic criterion?*

1. 2017 – currently being run. 2016 – No round undertaken. 2015 – 36 points awarded

2. 35 Eligible Consultants, £2,957 per point

Observer - Chairman of LNC*

4. New panel as above for each round

5. Invites are sent out to those eligible, they then submit an application.

Criteria – Permanent Consultant with at least 2 years' service, with the Trust, up to the date the award will be paid from.
