I am writing in response to your request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 in relation to the repair of medical devices.

## You asked:

- 1. How much did you spend from 6th April 2019 to 5th April 2020 on the repair of rigid endoscopes?
- 2. Which company did you have the highest spend with during 19/20 year for the repair of rigid endoscopes and how much was this?
- 3. How much did you spend from 6th April 2019 to 5th April 2020 on the repair of power tools?
- 4. Which company did you have the highest spend with during 19/20 year on the repair of power tools and how much was this?
- 5. How much did you spend from 6th April 2019 to 5th April 2020 on the repair of surgical instruments?

## Trust response:

- 1. £22,776.95 Excl VAT
- 2.
