Freedom of Information Act 2000

I am writing in response to your request for information made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 in relation to Down Syndrome.

You asked:

- 1. Letters sent to expectant women advising of screening tests following combined/quadruple screen testing for Down Syndrome. I understand the letter may be different depending on whether results are low or high chance so please send examples of each.
- 2. Letters/results from Non-Invasive Prenatal Testing (NIPT), again high and low chance examples if different.
- 3. Examples of information eg. letters, leaflets, signposting etc. shared with expectant women about these tests (combined/quadruple screening and NIPT).
- 4. Any information shared with expectant women about Down Syndrome itself (including guidance on pregnancy/care when given an antenatal diagnosis).

Screening Test Result – Quadruple Screening for Down's Syndrome

Please find enclosed a copy of your Quadruple Screening Test Result which is "screen positive" for Down's syndrome. You will see at the bottom of the report that most women with screen positive results will <u>not</u> have a baby affected by Down's syndrome. We have talked on the phone about what this result means to you and the options for further testing if you wish.

You will also see from the report, that your result is low chance for Edward's syndrome

I have sent you information about Amniocentesis and you are aware there is a 1% chance of miscarriage following this procedure. We will speak to you again in a few days to discuss your decision regarding further testing.

I have just been speaking with you on the phone, so with your consent to send this email, I am writing to enclose information about your screening result and options. I know there is a lot to take in, but below is a summary of our discussions today. Please take your time to read through this information and the attachments

The screening test has given a 1 in xxx chance of Down's syndrome - see attached. This is a chance of xxx% which means xxx % chance baby does NOT have Down's. Screening for Edwards and Patau's syndrome is low chance.

Just to re-iterate, the options are:

1) no further testing. Your next routine screening test would be your anomaly scan at 20 weeks. Please be aware it is not possible to rule out or diagnose Down's syndrome from ultrasound alone

2) CVS - see attachment. CVS is offered at Medway Hospital.

3) Amniocentesis - see attachment. Amnio offered at Medway Hospital between 16 - 18 weeks of pregnancy.

Results of CVS or amniocentesis usually take approximately 3 working days and give you a "yes" or "no" result as to whether baby is affected by Down's syndrome

Both the CVS and amniocentesis procedure has a 0.5% procedure related chance of miscarriage. Out of every 200 women having one of these invasive tests, 199 women will not miscarry, but one woman will miscarry as a result of the procedure. Unfortunately there is no way to predict who this will happen to, or to prevent it. A 4th option is Non Invasive Prenatal Testing (eg Harmony) which is currently only available privately (costs around £300 - £700). Some women are choosing to look into this before deciding about an invasive test as it is more accurate than the combined test and does not carry the risks associated with invasive tests.

The results take approximately 10-14 working days and it is not quite a 100% result. If the result of Non Invasive Prenatal Testing is positive, then an invasive test (amniocentesis) would be recommended to confirm.

Ultrasound alone cannot rule out or detect Down's syndrome, so if you feel you need to know for sure, then further testing is the only way to find out before the birth. On the other hand, if it wouldn't actually make any difference to how you proceed with the pregnancy, then you may prefer not to take the risk of an invasive test.

It can be difficult to decide whether or not to take testing further and there is an organisation called **ARC (Antenatal Results & Choices)** who offer information and support to parents throughout antenatal testing. They have a phone number which parents can call when they want someone else to talk things through with.
