For Medical Examiner Reviews - currently no software package use Excel spreadsheets but we will have the National Medical Examiner system once it goes live.

8. Clinical Audit – currently Access databases for both clinical audit annual programme and action plan monitoring. Currently exploring the purchase of external software to replace Access as no Datix module available. IQVIA and Symbiotix are used for other types of audit. 9.

## CQC:

The Trust is registered with the CQC who will monitor, inspect and regulate services across the Trust using the KLOE regulatory Framework: Safe, Effective, Caring, Response and Well Led. The CQC are reviewing their current approach to regulation and the Trust has fully engaged with the consultation process.

The Trust's system approach to CQC is through a continuous quality improvement framework monitored via the Quality improvement Committee which reports directly to the Trust Management Executive and the Main Quality Committee. CQC preparedness forms part of the Board Assurance framework. The Trust has regularly engagement events with the CQC. There are currently no plans to change the continuous quality improvement system approach but by nature of continuous improvement this will ensure the programme of work will progress / change to reflect this.
