Initially it was difficult to get senior obstetricians to understand the importance of attending MDT training in a learning capacity, this was overcome with plenty of face to face meetings and involvement of junior obstetric staff who were encouraged to provide feedback. We invested in training for the team leading the in house programme, and sent a multidisciplinary team to that training. Training obstetricians and midwives together, so that they were invested in the programme, meant that it was easier to sell the ethos of MDT training once we rolled it out formally.

The obstetric team offer compulsory suturing and perineal assessment courses for all specialist trainees, which are provided off site by other providers.

Obstetric trainees and newly qualified midwives have a structured programme of training on perineal trauma and repair. Although the initial formal classroom training might not be very long, the training then continues in a one to one capacity on the delivery suite. These hours of informal training cannot be

summarised in hours spent in training. They are evidenced in the competency documents of the obstetric and midwifery staff. Both professional groups require formal sign off of this competency. Other staff are invited to attend the weekly suturing workshop which lasts for 3 hours and is facilitated by a practice development midwife and a consultant obstetrical with a special interest in urogynae.

Personal development plans identified at appraisals were not acted upon
