







Q8 Do you ever refer to the digital images from previous rounds for educational purposes.





Q9 Have you ever referred colleagues/trainees to digital images from the EQA Scheme?





Q10 If using digital images, are you aware of the Guidelines for Using Digital Images document on the EQA website?





Q11 Would you remain a participant of the scheme if all cases were digital only?




