What is work experience?

Did you know, there are more than 350 careers in the NHS? Some roles involve direct contact with patients, while others form a vast support network vital to delivering healthcare.

Work experience offers an unpaid opportunity to explore these careers in an organisational setting.

Work experience is available for:

- Secondary school students
- Post-16 students, including those at college, A-Level students, undergraduates and postgraduates
- Adults not in full time education
- Adults interested in a career change
- Those who are currently unemployed
- Those who have had a career break and are looking to explore a new career

Work experience helps individuals prepare for professional study and future career opportunities. The placement allows you to shadow and observe what a job is really like, understand the demands of the career, and find out whether it would be suitable for you. We do not offer any 'hands on' experience.

Placement lengths can vary depending on what the department can offer, however we provide short-term placements that last between two and five days.

We currently offer placements at two points in the year: during the Easter holidays and during the summer (June, July, August).

| The application process

All applications must come through the Work Experience team via mtw-tr.workexperience@nhs.net

Please do not contact departments directly as they are extremely busy and your application will not be processed.

This brochure will help you complete your application form, which you can find on the 'Work experience' page on our website. Please note any applications received outside of the application window will not be accepted or processed.

Each work experience placement has its own entry requirements, including age restrictions. You should check the criteria before applying.

Most placements take place at Maidstone Hospital or Tunbridge Wells Hospital, or sometimes across both sites.

Placement availability is limited and demand is extremely high, so you are advised to consider your area of interest carefully and express this clearly in your application. Make sure you are honest in your application, and that you obtain hand-written signatures. If you are at school, college or university, please use your tutor as a reference. This ensures they are aware of the placement and support your application. If you do not attend any educational institution, please obtain signatures from a line manager or trusted mentor.

Once you have applied for work experience and the application window has closed, the team will begin the blind shortlisting process.

Candidates will be shortlisted based on:

- Distance both home and school
- Protected characteristics
- Meeting expected department criteria
- Personal statement on application form

Candidates will be informed whether they have been successful. Details of our shortlisting criteria are provided on our website or on the application form.

| Clinical placements

We accept applications in clinical areas from individuals aged 16 and over, and from students in Year 12.

Medical

Those wanting to go to medical school to become a doctor can undertake a placement in one of a range of medical specialties. The placement will consist of three days (normally Tuesday to Thursday) at either Maidstone or Tunbridge Wells Hospital. Applicants can express a preference for a placement in a particular area of interest, but this cannot be guaranteed.

Examples of placements in specialties:

- Accident & Emergency
- Acute Medicine
- Cardiology
- Gastroenterology
- Geriatric Medicine
- Intensive Care Unit

Individuals who are 17 years and older at the time of the placement will also be able to request a placement within Surgery, Trauma & Orthopaedics, Anaesthetics or Oncology.

Criteria

- Minimum of five GCSEs at Grade 9-6 (A*-B), including English, Maths, Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Be studying towards and expect to achieve the qualifications required for a career in medicine
- Be committed to applying to a UK medical school within the next 12 months

Availability

 We can accommodate placements throughout the year apart from December, January or during the summer, as these are exceptionally busy times



Nursing and healthcare

Our eight-week programme includes nursing and a range of healthcare careers. This placement will involve a general overview of this career and many others in a two hour after-school session once a week for eight weeks.

Attendance for all sessions is required. We do not offer any opportunities in paediatrics.

This opportunity is ideal for those interested in healthcare careers but unsure which area to specialise in. Each week will explore a different profession and involve department tours, presentations and interactive, hands-on activities.

Examples of specialties:

- Nursing
- Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy
- Dietetics and Speech and Language Therapy
- Pharmacy
- Diagnostic Radiography and Therapeutic Radiology
- Ophthalmology

Criteria

- Extremely caring individual
- Curious about healthcare careers
- Individual must demonstrate enthusiasm and professionalism

Availability

 20 spaces available for the programme at Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells hospitals starting in the first week of June



Pathology

This four-day placement will involve exploring how the laboratory works at Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells hospitals and spending one day in each Pathology discipline: microbiology, cellular pathology, blood sciences and point of care testing.

Criteria

 Display keen interest in biomedical science and pathology

Availability

 Seven placements: one individual per week across June and July



I found the placement incredibly informative, as it really opened my eyes to the range of careers that I am now considering.

I also learnt a lot during my time on the ward, not only related to careers, but also the treatments and care given to patients with different conditions, which I found very interesting.

Diagnostic Radiography

Experience an exciting day with the Diagnostic Radiography team where you will observe a range of X-rays and CT scanning. In addition, you may be rotated through fluoroscopy, ultrasound and Nuclear medicine, depending on your preferences.

Criteria

- Age 18 and over. With a keen interest in a clinical role and radiology/diagnostic imaging
- GCSE Grade 4 (C) or above in Maths, Science, and English
- Be studying towards or already achieved A-Levels (minimum grades BBC), including a science or equivalent BTEC – 112 UCAS points

Availability

- Several placements available during the Easter holidays
- · Several placements available in July and August

Therapeutic Radiology

We have Radiotherapy placements available at either our Maidstone Hospital or Kent and Canterbury Hospital, where you will spend the day observing treatment procedures and CT planning, and discuss opportunities with specialist radiographers.

Criteria

- Must demonstrate a keen interest in radiology
- GCSE Grade 4 (C) or above in Maths, Science, and English
- Be studying towards or already achieved A-Level qualifications or equivalent in Physics, Chemistry, Biology or Human Biology

- Four placements available during the Easter holidays
- Several placements available in July and August



Physiotherapy

Gain an insight into the day-to-day life of a physiotherapist during a two-day placement, exploring patient treatment plans to increase their mobility and/ or function following injury, illness, or surgery.

Criteria

- Must be comfortable with bodily fluids
- Be interested in studying Physiotherapy at University or completing a degree apprenticeship
- Minimum five GCSEs Grade 9-4 (A*-C) including English Language, Maths, and at least one Science
- Be studying towards or already achieved two or three A-Levels (or equivalent), including Biology and/or PE

Availability

• Several placements available in June and July

Occupational Therapy

You will observe occupational therapists as they assess patients' independence and ability to conduct everyday tasks on this two-day placement.

Working with the Discharge team, you will assess whether the patient has the appropriate equipment in place to be discharged to live independently.

This placement will provide a good overview of occupational therapy specialties including orthopaedics, stroke, intensive care and neurology.

Criteria

- Patient individual who is a good communicator Minimum five GCSEs, Grade 9-4 (A*-C) including Science
- Be studying towards or already achieved two or three A-Levels

Availability

• Several placements available in July

Dietetics

Spend one day with the Dietetics team where you will observe the team assess, diagnose, and treat nutritional and dietary problems. You will attend team meetings, observe staff completing nutrition updates before the ward rounds, and observe the creation of community referral plans before the patient is discharged.

Criteria

- Minimum five GCSEs Grade 9-4 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Science
- Be considering studying the subject at university or as a degree apprenticeship (to study Dietetics, you must be on track for AAA at A-Level or equivalent)

Availability

• Several placements available in June and July





Speech and Language Therapy

Spend two days with the Speech and Language teams assessing patients' communication and swallow. You will also attend team meetings and debriefs. If you have a particular interest in being placed on a stroke ward, please state this in your application.

Criteria

- Good communicator
- Minimum five GCSEs Grade 9-4 (A*-C), including English Language, Maths and Science
- Be studying towards or already achieved two or three A-Levels

Availability

• Several placements available in June and July

Audiology

Spend five days with the Audiology team observing patient appointments for hearing assessments, hearing aid fittings and repairs. Learn about the process of hearing and how hearing can be tested in adults and children. Assist with restocking rooms and ensuring clinical leaflets are provided. Observe the reception area and admin responsibilities.

Criteria

- Display a keen interest in audiology/ear, nose and throat, with science and technical interest
- Minimum five GCSEs 4-9 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Science
- Be studying towards or already achieved two or three A-level qualifications (or equivalent) in science subjects

- One placement available during the Easter holidays
- Two placements available in the summer

Pharmacy

This five-day placement will involve shadowing staff in daily tasks such as dispensing, accuracy checking and medicines management in a ward setting with pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and clinical pharmacy assistants, pharmacy stores, pharmacy distribution services and automation such as the dispensing robot and Omnicell stock cabinets.

Criteria

- Minimum five GCSEs 4-9 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Science
- Be passionate about the subject and considering studying it at university or as an apprenticeship

Availability

 One placement available per week at each hospital throughout July

Oncology Pharmacy

This brand new three-day Oncology Pharmacy placement involves similar tasks to the Pharmacy placement, but will be more specifically involved in the treatment of cancer.

Criteria

- Minimum five GCSEs 4-9 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Sciencee
- Be passionate about the subject and considering studying it at university or as an apprenticeship

- Two placements available during the Easter holidays
- One placement per week available in June



Medical Physics

This five-day placement will involve shadowing a range of disciplines within Medical Physics. This includes nuclear medicine, radiation physics, radiation engineering, computer sciences and radiotherapy physics. Please note, under 18s will be more limited in terms of exposure to radiation in Radiation Physics.

Criteria

- Interested in pursuing medical Physics as a career
- Be studying towards or already achieved A-Level in Physics

Availability

• Several placements available in June and July

Maternity

This five-day placement will involve shadowing a midwife to understand the role and scope of midwifery practice – this may include community, birth centres and acute hospital care.



Criteria

- GCSE Grade 4 (C) and above in Maths and English
- Be passionate about the subject and considering studying the subject at university or as a degree apprenticeship. Please note that Midwifery is a competitive degree course with high expectations of academic grades
- Comfortable with exposure to bodily fluids and sensitive information

- Four placements available during the Easter holidays
- Several placements available in June, July and August

Healthcare Science – Cardiology

You will observe cardiac healthcare scientists performing tests used to diagnose and monitor patients with a range of heart conditions. During this four or five day placement at Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells hospitals you will observe ECGs, Holter monitors, exercise tolerance tests, echocardiography, pacing clinics, pacemaker implants and coronary angiography.

Criteria

- Must demonstrate a keen interest in becoming a cardiac healthcare scientist.
- Good communicator and keen to observe minor surgical procedures
- GCSE Grade 5 (B) or above in Maths, English and Science
- Be studying towards A-Llevels or equivalent including at least one science subject, and expected to achieve BBB/120 UCAS points

Availability

- Two placements available in the Easter holidays
- Several placements available during June, July and August

Research and Innovation (clinical)

You'll get the opportunity to shadow our clinical research professionals observing the delivery of clinical trials in areas including maternity, gastroenterology, stroke, and trauma & orthopaedics.

You will attend team meetings, observe staff consenting patients and performing trial procedures (where appropriate) and participate in research administration.

If you are interested in a particular area of clinical research please state this in your application.

Criteria

- Age 18 and over
- Minimum five GCSEs Grade 9-4 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Science
- Be interested in a research-oriented career in healthcare, or healthcare leadership

- One placement available over the Easter holidays
- One placement available over July and August



| Non-clinical placements

We accept applications in non-clinical areas from individuals aged 15 and over and in Year 10, however some departments may have age restrictions in place.



Communications

Spend three days shadowing the Communications team. You will learn more about their roles, see how they respond to media enquiries, and draft copy for their communication channels, including digital newsletters and social media. You may also observe planning meetings with different departments, and may potentially go around the hospital following up on staff stories, capturing photos and videos.

Criteria

Interest in writing, journalism, social media, video and photography

Availability

• Two placements available during the summer

Digital Transformation and Clinical Software

This department is offering a five-day placement with our Clinical Software System team. This placement will involve working with various teams.



Placement outline

- One day will be spent with the Sunrise Business Change team, where you will be involved in stakeholder meetings to capture the changes that are required, writing a functional specification document, validating changes within the system and/or supporting troubleshooting
- One day will be spent with the Sunrise Configuration team, which will include translating the functional specification paper document from the Business Change team into a design using software
- One day will be spent with the Clinical Systems Testing team, which will involve going through testing scripts and testing out new functionality
- Two days will be spent with the Clinical Systems
 Management team, which will involve going through
 all the clinical systems that are supported, preparing
 computer log in packs for staff, and learning about
 the IT helpdesk and how we support users with a
 range of issues with password resets. There will also be
 an opportunity to join the Information Technology team
 for half a day to learn about the infrastructure our clinical
 systems rely on

- One placement available during the Easter holidays
- Three placements available during the summer



Information Technology

The IT department is offering a three-day placement. This placement will involve working with various teams and shadowing members who work with systems, networks, desktop devices, our IT service desk and IT projects.

Placement outline

- Those interested in IT and software systems will spend their placement at Tunbridge Wells or Maidstone hospitals to observe the desktop team as they support with a range of IT issues which may be in a various departments
- Those interested in cyber security or our systems and servers will be based in our Maidstone office

Availability

• Several placements available in June and July

Finance

This five-day placement will involve spending some time within the Purchase Ledger, Sales Ledger and Cash, Capital and Charitable Funds teams.

Depending on your interests, you may even be able to spend time with our colleagues who work on costing, income and financial management.

Criteria

• Interest in Finance

Availability

Several placements available throughout June and July

Learning and Development

The Learning and Development department are offering a four to five-day placement. This will involve working with the Libraries, Learning, Systems and Compliance, and Career Development teams.

This placement may also involve an insight into other teams such as the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion team.


Criteria

• Interest in HR and learning and development

Availability

Several placements available every other week in June and July





Clinical Coding and Business Intelligence:

In this five-day placement you'll spend three days with the Clinical Coding team and discover the vital role they play in financing and supporting the NHS. You will have an opportunity to have a go at Clinical Coding yourself, learning how to transform clinical information into coded data, which is a highly specialist skill.

You will spend the final two days with the Business Intelligence team learning about the analysis of data to drive operational and strategic decision making. Shadowing information analysts you'll get an overview of the BI team and Statutory Mandatory Returns (data sent to regulators to provide assurance), take a look at some of the reporting that drives decision making at MTW and have the opportunity to analyse a dataset for trends and themes.

If you are interested in healthcare but unsure about direct patient care this could be an opportunity for you. You will learn how clinical coding and business intelligence fits into the workings of a hospital trust.

Criteria

- Demonstrate a keen interest in biology, in particular anatomy and physiology
- Have an interest in data and use of Microsoft Office tools such as Excel
- Minimum five GCSEs (or studying towards) Grade
 9-4 including English Language, Maths and at least one Science

- One placement available in the Easter holidays
- One placement available in the summer months

Research and Innovation (non-clinical):

Spend time with the Investigator-Led Research and Innovation team learning about the design and development of health research and the processes and regulations ensuring it is safe, legal, and ethical.

You will attend team meetings, research administration and engagement activities (e.g. archiving study documents and producing promotional materials) and other relevant activities as they arise.

Criteria:

- Age 18 and over
- Minimum five GCSEs Grade 9-4 (A*-C) including Maths, English and Science
- Be interested in a research-oriented career in healthcare, or healthcare leadership

- One placement available over the Easter holidays
- One placement available over July and August



| What next?

One of the benefits of work experience is learning about yourself and what you enjoy. It can enable you to understand what skills and qualifications you may need to progress into that career.

It can also uncover your strengths, including skills you already possess and also highlight what learning may need to take place to bridge any gaps in your knowledge or current skillset.

It demonstrates to employers that you are willing to learn, take your own initiative to better yourself and enhance your knowledge, skills and workplace behaviours.

The opportunity allows you to network and build professional connections to help with your next steps.

After your work experience, you may be interested in exploring further opportunities, including university or college courses, apprenticeships or employment. Volunteering

Volunteering could be your next step after work experience.

Once it has been confirmed that your application for work experience has been successful, you will be asked if you would like the Volunteering team to get in contact with you regarding any volunteering opportunities.

Volunteering requires three to four hours of work per week for six months. Once you have completed 60 hours, a written reference will be provided for you. If you are under 18, you will only be able to volunteer between 9am and 5pm on weekdays and will not be allowed into some areas, such as children's wards.

Apprenticeships

An apprenticeship is a training programme that is undertaken while working, and can be completed at any age post-16 and at any stage of your career.
